Fire Alarm Upgrades

Requested: Approval to Proceed with Project

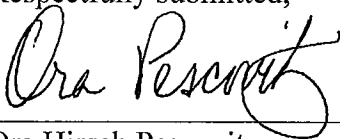
Background:

Constructed in 1986, University Hospital and the A. Alfred Taubman Health Care Center together provide approximately 2.3 million gross square feet that house inpatient and outpatient medical services. This project will upgrade the fire alarm control panels in both buildings to connect the systems, provide greater flexibility for future expansion, and improve central monitoring abilities. The scope of the project includes the architectural, mechanical, and electrical work necessary to accomplish these improvements. There will be no impact on parking from this project.

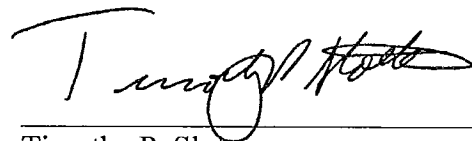
The estimated cost of the project is \$3,000,000. Funding will be provided from Hospitals and Health Centers' resources. The construction cash flow may be provided, all or in part, by bond proceeds or increasing the commercial paper issuance under the commercial paper program, secured by a pledge of General Revenues, and authorized by the Board of Regents. The University of Michigan Department of Architecture, Engineering and Construction will manage the project. A phased construction schedule is planned in order to minimize disruption to patient care, with construction to be completed in summer of 2013.

We recommend that the Board of Regents approve the University of Michigan Hospitals and Health Centers University Hospital and A. Alfred Taubman Health Care Center Fire Alarm Upgrades project as described, and authorize issuing the project for bids and awarding a design and construction contract providing that bids are within the approved budget.
